





# Alando Mendoza




On June 3, 2 days before he was 5 months post op, Drew was cleared 100% with no restrictions to return to football and wrestling. 




# Killian Piner



My son is 12 years old, and is a competitive swimmer and baseball player. He is in 6th grade and is very handsome. He loves sports and I think he would be perfect for this.






# Shawn Travis

She was diagnosed with an immunodeficiency, celiac disease, chronic respiratory disease, asthma, microcytic anemia, cyclic neutropenia, migranes and GERD. She had in home nursing care 20 hrs per day for the first 5 years of her life. She was on about 15 meds daily, breathing treatment every 2 hours around the clock, required oxygen support frequently while sleeping and had to get weekly infusions of gamma globulin for her immune system issues. She coded at 3 years old and had to be flown to a children's hospital. Her doctors didn't think she would be able to attend school or play sports. When kindergarten enrollment time came she looked at her doctor and told him she was going to school and would someday be a doctor to help kids like herself.

She started Kindergarten that year. That year she decided she wanted to try soccer. We had to get a very long oxygen tube and run up and down the field behind her because she was too little to carry the tank and run but she did it. That summer her sister was playing softball and Takiya picked up a softball for the first time. She immediately fell in love. When she was 8 her health had improved enough that her doctors cleared her to play. She had to take her oxygen tanks into the dugout and would hook up to it between innings but she never missed a game. A coach asked the girls if any of them wanted to learn to pitch. She raised her tiny little arm and that moment she found her purpose and destiny. The next summer at just 9 years old she was picked up by a 12U travel team. At the first tournament the pitcher broke her leg. My tiny little mighty girl was told to warm up and get on the mound. She pitched that whole

tournament and was given an MVP by the opposing team coaches. Since that summer she has worked constantly to be the best player and teammate she could. At 13 she was picked up to pitch by 16 and 18U teams. No matter how sick she was she has never missed a tournament. She has left the ball park in an ambulance and I cannot count the times I have driven her straight to the ER after a tournament. Her goal to become a doctor is still her plan. She carries a 3.8 GPA and recently won an academic scholarship for a full ride post high school. She plans to play softball in college while being pre-med. She also wants to play for USSSA pride.
