She is also an honorary team member of the Framingham State University softball team,









Scott Kaveny was born on September 8th, 1983 in Seoul, Korea and as a twin brother. He was then adopted to America with his twin at 3 months old. He started out as a child loving rollerblading and was inspired by the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, GA. In his teenage years, he started to get into snowboarding and gymnastics.

Although he was a great snowboarder and gymnast throughout his teens, he decided to switch to skiing at age 23. Even though he started very late and never went to ski school, he learned it all himself and got good really quick. In the next couple years, he was already going down black diamond slopes and decided to enroll in his first USSA competition for mogul skiing on April 5, 2008 and his first summer at the freestyle pool at the Utah Olympic Park camp to learn ski jumps that same summer.

After that summer, he was hooked, but had a series of events that held him back for a while. Despite all the trouble, injuries, lack of support, falls, ridicule, and financial difficulties, Scott persevered and stayed the course. In 2013, he was able to get from top to bottom with a spread eagle and twister spread as his two tricks with no problem.

Fast forward to today, he currently lives at the Utah Olympic Park Residences as a registered athlete. He's a well respected athlete on the Park City Freestyle Ski Team (PCSS) and was told he was the "most dedicated athlete" they had. He has gotten a full on water and backflip/layout on snow. He will also be getting his dual citizenship around the middle of this year for Korea so he can later have a choice between either representing the US Freestyle Ski Team or the Korean Freestyle Ski Team for international competitions. He plans on skiing for several more years to stretch his potential and is an example to many younger athletes.

Most importantly, he wants to remind younger athletes to not give up on their dreams, fail fast and forward, and continue progressing regardless of age, health issues, or limiting beliefs. As a mentor and friend, who's a two-time Olympian for Argentina named Clyde Getty, once told him "age is only in the mind".
